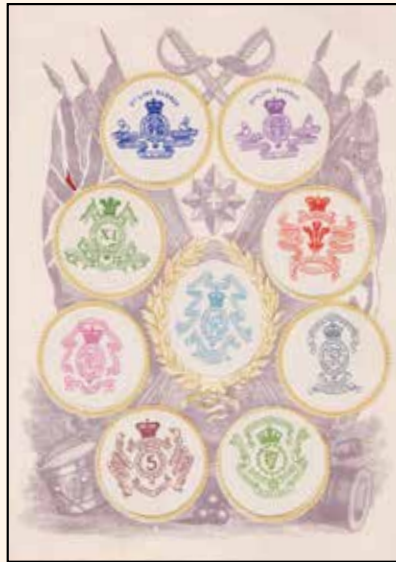

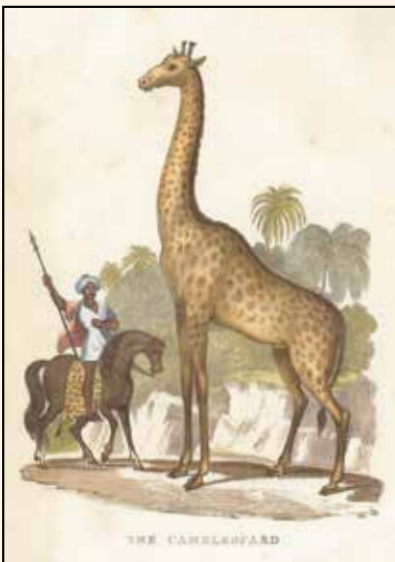

CONJUNCTIONS are words that join sentences and words together. you and I walk together but we did not reach London yet we saw it. and, but, yet are all conjunctions.

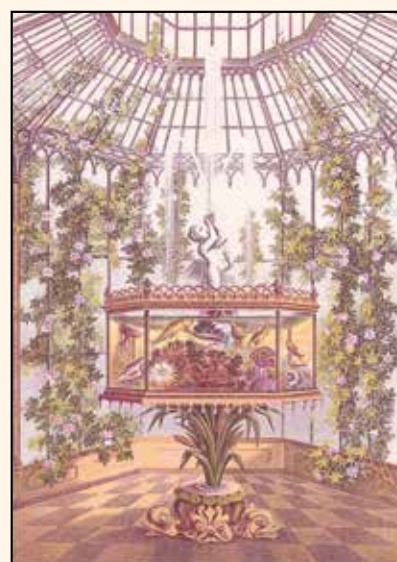

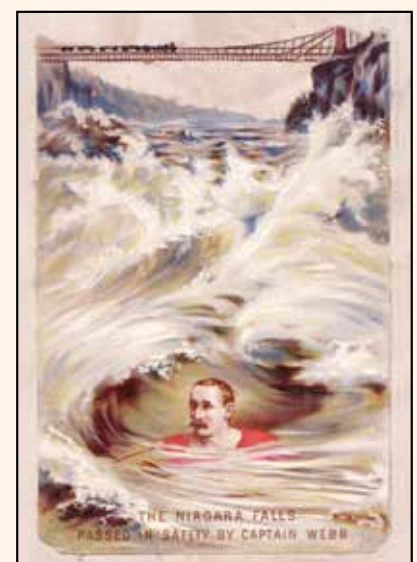


INTERJECTIONS are exclamations denoting any sudden emotion of the mind, either of pain, pleasure, or surprise.

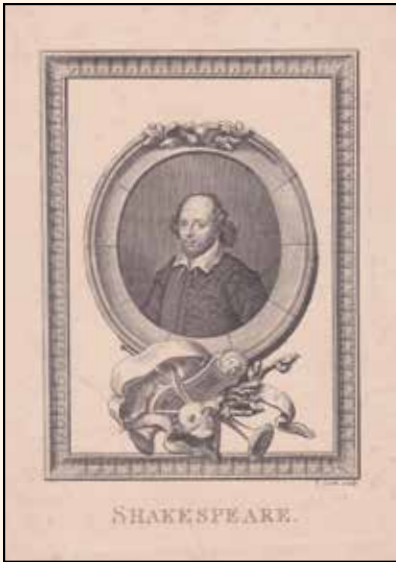
